

A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF MEDICAL PUBLICATIONS
RELATING TO SRI LANKA, 1811 - 1976

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INTRODUCTION

The under-documentation of the expanding Third World output in medical research is a matter for increasing concern among those interested in a balanced dissemination of medical information. In Sri Lanka, too great a reliance on western based medical documentation has resulted in a situation where the local researcher is more readily informed of foreign references to his topic than of relevant local references. The current international data bases are unable to absorb the total world output in medical research. It is therefore necessary to think in terms of supplementary documentation at national level. Such documentation should aim at a comprehensive coverage of local material, using a methodology and a format which is minimally compatible with the international indexes.

Despite the fact that Sri Lanka boasts of over a hundred and fifty years of sustained adherence to the tenets of Western Medicine, there is little systematic documentation of the subject. National bibliographic control exists, but is of recent origin. Ceylon National Bibliography (1962 -) later Sri Lanka National Bibliography lists books on medicine. Sri Lanka Science Index (1977 -) indexes periodical and newspaper articles on medicine, but does not

separate research findings, extension material and journalistic articles. These indexes are rendered somewhat ineffective by inadequate coverage, problems of currency and the lack of cumulations. Only one local periodical is currently indexed outside the island, namely Ceylon Medical Journal in Index Medicus. The international picture as regards Sri Lanka material is therefore somewhat bleak. A few studies relating to national publications have appeared on the scene, largely as requirements for basic and advanced library qualifications. A Bibliography of Ceylon by H.A.I. Goonetilleke (1967)¹ has a section on 'diseases, the introduction of western medicine and public hygiene'. A bibliography on safety and health of workers in Sri Lanka by G.L.S. Suriarachchi (1975)² covers occupational health. Survey of the origins and development of the biomedical literature of Sri Lanka by M.A.F. Senadhira (1974)³ reviews the history of medical literature in the country.

The existing output is too limited and fragmented to offer a comprehensive coverage of the total field. Therefore a bibliography specific to Sri Lanka medical publications appeared desirable. Initially, thinking in rigid technical terms, a simple comprehensive index to local medical periodicals was planned. It soon became apparent however, that the

real need was for a single collection of the local research material, presented in such a way that local data and local norms emerged easily. The significance of such a functionally evolved subject scope is readily apparent. If the perspectives of Western Medicine are to be related meaningfully to the indigenous scene, such data, norms and access to the local research material are indispensable.

SCOPE

This bibliography consists of a core collection of hitherto unlisted local material combined with similar material published abroad. However, this is not a bibliography of all medical publications issued in Sri Lanka. Neither is it a bibliography of all medical research published by Sri Lankans. Publications exclusively based on foreign data, by Sri Lankan scientists, is excluded.

This bibliography contains publications on human health and disease in Sri Lanka, as viewed from the perspective of Western Medicine. It also includes related subjects such as the history of western medicine in Sri Lanka, the study of indigenous medical systems vis-a-vis western medicine, medicinal plants, forensic medicine, medical legislation and biography. Health education material and other extension publications are not included.

Books, theses, dissertations, periodical articles and research communications, government sessional papers and other government documents, published reports, "published" conference papers, and microfilms are listed. Annual reports, newspaper articles and textbooks are excluded. It is regretted that due to practical reasons, WHO reports are under documented.

Historically, this work covers the British Period of Sri Lanka history and moves onward to the present period. This corresponds to the span within which western medicine entrenched itself as a premier medical system in the country.

The years mentioned in the title, namely 1811 and 1976 represent the earliest and latest dates of publication included in the bibliography. The bulk of the references date from the 1850's, when local medical publications began to appear. It must be remembered that some periodicals run late in putting out their issues. The 'List of Periodicals' indicates the actual issues used for this bibliography - some of these stop far short of 1976.

The majority of the entries are in English, with a few in French, German, Italian and Sinhala. Entries appear in their original language. A limited number of locations are also given.

Items were selected for inclusion solely on the basis of the Sri Lanka data they contained. Any article which contained significant Sri Lanka data, however small quantitatively was automatically included. Articles of a general or introductory nature were excluded, also those which did not contain Sri Lanka data. No other criteria were used in selecting material.

Contemporaneous bibliographies in related subjects have been taken into consideration in designing this bibliography. Problems relating to references in the pure and natural sciences were considerably reduced by the welcome arrival of Bibliography of scientific publications relating to Sri Lanka 1960-1976 by N.A.W.T. Alwis (1978)⁴ and the supplements issued to date. Except where references deal directly with human health, items included in Alwis' bibliography are excluded from ours. Bibliography on the Sri Lanka Child by Manil Silva (1979)⁵ carries references to the psychological development of the child - a category omitted from our bibliography.

Certain of the socio-economic subject sections are not treated in depth and coverage is not exhaustive. 'Health services' and the various statistics sub-divisions 'births' 'maternal mortality' 'morbidity'

'mortality' 'vital statistics' have not been treated as thoroughly as the sections on curative medicine. A further bibliography covering the welfare services will include these subjects.

ARRANGEMENT

This bibliography consists of a subject section and an author index. The subject section is based on Medical Subject Headings 1977 (MeSH) issued by the National Library of Medicine, USA and published in Cumulated Index Medicus Vol 18, 1977. Under each subject heading entries are listed in chronological order according to the year of publication and thereafter alphabetically by author and title. In a few instances serially numbered articles appearing in the same year have been placed next to each other, breaking the alphabetical sequence. Subject indexing has been done according to title and not after examination of the text. Due to this limitation, headings are given only for the main topic/topics of the article. This is usually the name of a disease. No cross-referencing by part of body, type of patient, drugs or other related aspects of medical information has been attempted. Index entries are usually specific to the main topic discussed, but in a few instances, references have been listed under broad headings, rather than specific headings.

The bibliographical elements included in each entry are listed in the following order:

For books, monographs, reports, microfilms:

Author, title of article, title of publication (underlined) place of publication, publisher, year of publication, pagination.

For periodical articles:

Author, title of article, journal title (underlined) or abbreviation, volume number, issue number, year, pagination.

However, a few entries have been incorporated into the text without complete information on pagination and illustrations.

An asterisk against a subject heading indicates a heading not included in MeSH. The double asterisk against numbered entries indicates unexamined references obtained from MEDLARS. The single asterisk against numbered entries indicates other unexamined material which appears to have a place in this work. A limited number of unconfirmed bibliographic references have been included in this category. These appear to be lost material which users of the bibliography may be able to uncover.

METHOD

A strong feature of this work is the systematic coverage of local periodicals. All available medical periodicals were indexed. Non-medical science periodicals were not indexed as others had commenced work on them at about the same time. The major social-science periodicals were indexed and several little known and valuable references were obtained.

The coverage of foreign publications were considerably strengthened by the availability of a MEDLARS print-out listing all references contained in the data base on Sri Lanka in the period 1962-1976.

The following indexes to government sessional papers were consulted:

- iii. Index to Sessional Paper 1951 - 1959

References to subsidiary legislation were culled from:

- iv. A guide to subsidiary legislation June 1956 - March 1976. by J.A.Paul. Colombo : J.A.Paul, 1976.

References were obtained by scanning publications, and by requesting lists of publications from medical researchers. In this respect, wherever possible, researchers were approached personally. In addition, the staff of the following institutes were notified in October, 1977 : Medical Research Institute, General Hospital, Colombo, Faculty of Medicine, Colombo & Faculty of Medicine, Peradeniya. About the same time, a news item appeared in the Ceylon Daily News. Researchers living abroad were not contacted due to costs involved and the practical difficulties of obtaining addresses. The response to face to face requests were very favourable while the impersonal notices elicited a very poor response.

Most of the references listed in this work were examined in libraries in Sri Lanka. Many of the local publications were seen at the Sri Lanka Medical Library which houses the best collection of medical Ceyloniana in the country. Sri Lanka material was also provided by the collections of the National Museum Library, Main Library of the University of

Peradeniya, the Eye Hospital, Colombo and the International Planned Parenthood Federation - Indian Ocean Region-Office in Colombo. Foreign journals carrying articles pertaining to Sri Lanka were adequately available in the libraries of the two Faculties of Medicine, Colombo and Kandy and also at the Medical Research Institute. References which could not be checked in Sri Lanka, were checked at the British Medical Association and the London School of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene.

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A supplement updating this work to 1980 is presently under preparation. Users of this bibliography are therefore requested to bring to the notice of the compilers any omissions or errors found in this work, so that they may be incorporated into the supplement.
